






## Reflection on 2013 APAGE Annual Congress in Seoul, Korea

In October 2013, I was privileged to attend the 14<sup>th</sup> Annual congress of the Asia-Pacific Associaion for Gynecologic Endoscopiy and Minimal Invasive Therapy (APAGE). The conference was held for three days at The Ritz Carlton Hotel in Seoul, Korea. The APAGE, which was established in 2003, organized congresses and workshops in the Asia-Pacific regions. As a junior resident, I got the information of the the conference this year from the journal *Gynecology and Minimally Invasive Therapy (GMIT)*; and fortunately my abstract had been accepted for film presentation.





On the first day, I was interested in the presentation of Dr. Osama Shawki in the pre-congress education session. He introduced videos which foucsed on the application of office hysteroscopy to manage the endometrial polyps, intrauterine synechia, or congenital uterine abnormalities. In the film sessions, there were lots of fantastic demonstrations of surgical ideas and skills in single port surgeries or robotic surgeries in the field of gynecology oncology. One of the keynote speakers, Dr. Masaaki Andou showed the management of possible complications in laparoscopic surgeries, such as vascular or bowel injury and bladder perforation. I was impressed of the importance of intraoperattive recognition of the injuries as well as the skills of laparoscopic suturing repair.

The exhibition provided the opportunities to manipulate da Vinci surgical system and 3D imaging of laparoscopy. I was excited to use the high-tech platforms for the first time. Also, I was fortunate to participate in YAG meeting and learn the experiences of young doctors or fellows from different contries. Besides the educational activities, the performances in the gala dinner were awesome and the most attractive one is a Korean doctor with the single port decoration dancing "Single (port) ladies." After the closing ceremony, we had a great time having Korean barbecue and beer together at TAMIG reunion.

I would like to thank Dr. Chyi-Long Lee and Dr. Chih-Feng Yen in Chang Gung Memorial Hospital who encouraged me to attend the conference and the committee of 2013 APAGE for the well-organized meeting.



## Reflection on APAGE 2014 Workshop in C.C.I., Shanghai, China

At noon, March 13, I hurried to make my chores done and rushed to the airport, marching to Shanhai, where one of the only two Covidien training centers in East Asia locates in. The center is absolutely fantastic, in addition to free good coffee, it holds friendly atmosphere, well-functioning and cozy meeting hall and advanced hands-on work shop.

I had my hands-on course under guidance of Dr. Wattiez. I wonder what I've done to have such an opportunity to learn surgical skills from him. Dr. Wattiez is patient to clumsy hand like me, and always ready to show us tips and tricks to perform laparoscopic procedures better. This is the first chance for me to try laparoscopic bladder repair and paravascular dissection. I'm pretty glad that I didn't kill the pig with those complications demonstrated in Dr. Wattiez's lecture.

But the best experience is not only about hands-on workshop. Dr. Shingo Fujii gave an impressive lecture, which showed admirable understanding to the pelvic anatomy to a new-comer like me. I wish that someday I could also master in a specialty like Dr. Shingo Fujii did, and bring the sparkles to the followers. Dr. Lee opened my eyes about minimally invasive treatment, taking me out from the frame of "minimally invasive = laparoscopy". The lecture reminded me that I should always urge myself to form a vision about what I perform everyday. The vision comes from master in a specialty, and it is the key to upgrade both treatment to the patients and ideology about current practice. Dr. Wattiez took the audiences to cruise the world of complications in laparoscopic surgery. It's very refreshing ( well, partly because we are not facing the complications on the table) because he took a humor but informative way to elaborate the right attitude for an operator to deal with those miserable intraoperative complications. Dr. Huang gave us an innovative example about oncologic treatment. I learned that there will always be different but not only way to treat the patients. If we could think more and dare to make differences, then there may be new break through waiting for us. Dr. Lin brought us a perfect illustration of laparoscopic nerve sparing technique. It's the audiences' luck to learn Dr. Shingo Fujii's and Dr. Lin's experience at the same time. Besides from the lectures mentioned above, all the speakers gave the audiences valuable transmission of innovations and new ideas.

APAGE workshop is definitely where we want to be to have training of both knowledge and skill. The only pity is that I don't have vacation so frequently to attend more such activities. My greatest thanks to APAGE authority, for such educational experience, and CGMH department of OB&GYN, for giving me the opportunity to attend this workshop.

I would like to thank APAGE and STORZ for giving me this wonderful experience workshop. I am also grateful to Dr. Chyi-Long Lee for inviting me to join the workshop. For the first time I was given the opportunity to perform Hysteroscopy and 3D Laparoscopy. I am sure this experience will be of great importance to my future gynecologic surgeries.

# Reflection OF APAGE Regional Congress 2014, Singapore

We at Minimally invasive surgery unit of KK women's and Children's hospital in conjunction with APAGE, AAGL and Singhealth OBGYN Academic Clinical Program, Singapore, organized 2014 Regional Congress of the Asia-Pacific Association for Gynecologic Endoscopy and Minimally Invasive Therapy (12<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> June 2014, Singapore), "Hysterectomy and Managing Complications in Minimally Invasive Surgery". This was a worthwhile experience not only in terms of professional and academic developments, which were very immense and constructive but also in terms of an opportunity to meet the expert laparoscopic surgeons from across the globe, to share their views and experiences and learn from them. The venue was Academia, an iconic landmark in SGH Campus, in Singapore with state-of-art research laboratories, education and training facilities.

The Congress Chairman was Assoc Professof Bernard CHERN and Co-chairman Dr Suan Tiong BEH. Event Faculty comprised of around 40 eminent laparoscopic surgeons from Singapore and abroad such as USA, Australia, India and other regional countries. The 3-day Regional Congress started on Thursday, 12 June 2014 and ended on Saturday, 14 June 2014.

The first day was an exciting day of the precongress hands-on workshop which included wet lab and dry lab training sessions. One of the highlights of the event was the animal workshop led by Professor Fidel VALEA as the Chief Instructor, who is the Director of the Residency Program in Department of OB-GYN from Duke University School of Medicine. It was organized in Singapore under the guidance of faculty comprising of renowned multi-disciplinary international and regional surgeons such as gynae-endoscopic surgeons, colorectal surgeons and urologists.





The animal lab at Academia is very well equipped with endoscopic imaging system. There were 10 stations each in both the sessions, with 2 to 3 participants and 2 trainers per station so as to give maximum hands-on experience. The animals were in trendelenburg position under general anesthesia, simulating the real laparoscopic surgeries. It comprised of hands- on training for advanced laparoscopic procedures like laparoscopic hysterectomy, pelvic side wall dissection and managing complications like bladder, bowel, ureteric and blood vessel injury.

Besides the high resolution imaging system from Karl storz, with the support of our business partners we were able to provide an opportunity to delegates to try advanced energy sources like harmonic and enseal and also new hemostatic agents and adhesion barriers.

The dry lab exercises helped participants to get acquainted with procedures like laparoscopic suturing, hysteroscopic resection of myoma, laparoscopic myomectomy, cystectomy, 3D laparoscopy and to familiarize themselves with various advance energy devices.

The two pre-congress workshops left participants feeling more confident with laparoscopic procedures and devices and certainly more inclined to do better in laparoscopic surgeries.

On day-2, live surgeries were real time telecasted from KK Women's and Children's hospital to the event venue Academia. These were performed by renowned laparoscopic surgeons Professor CY LIU, Professor Masaaki ANDOU, Professor Giuseppe BIGATTI and Dr Rakesh SINHA, who are masters of their art. The live surgeries included hysterectomy in severe endometriosis, hysterectomy in large uterus and laparoscopic management of pelvic organ prolapse. Attendees could real time watch the surgeries and interact with surgeons during the process. Apart from these lectures, video presentations and debates were organized covering various aspects of hysterectomy and managing complications by minimally access surgery.

We would like to thank APAGE, AAGL and Professor Chyi-Long LEE for giving us this opportunity to conduct this regional congress in Singapore and for endorsing our event. We are grateful to all the international and local faculties for taking time out of their busy schedules and train our delegates. Our special thanks to our various business partners Karl Storz, Olympus, JnJ and others whose contributions made this workshop and congress possible. It was indeed a memorable workshop and Congress and we intend to do it regularly to provide a platform for learning for the budding laparoscopic surgeons.

# **MOU Ceremony for BCAT Program**

Though the anatomy is different, the simulation is good enough to have a feel of how it is to be in an actual laparoscopy set up. We got to do port entry, ligation of the tubes, suturing and re-anastomosis of the ureters. Indeed a wonderful experience!

During the second day, more interesting lectures were given by prominent speakers and we got to watch interesting videos of different cases from different hospitals.

I can say that attending this workshop is a very worthwhile experience. I am grateful to APAGE and TAMIG for making this possible. And it is an endeavour worth doing again in the future







# Reflection on the 1st RGE Rajavithi Gynecological Endoscopy Congress:: Let's make the difference, Bangkok, Thailand.

Nowadays, Laparoscopic Surgery has very importance role for GYN Surgery as it can replace almost traditional surgery. Besides, Laparoscopic Surgical skill always needs to be practiced and improved. So, that is why the conference is very useful for the participant.

On the first day of the conference, I saw the overview and progression of the Laparoscopic Surgery from all specialists who came from many institutes in Thailand including Prof. Chyi Long Lee and Prof. Kuan Gen Huang, well-known international experts. He had done Hysteroscopic myomectomy for large submucous myoma proficiently which be my new vision and inspiration to practice to use Hysteroscopy in the future.

For the final day, Hands on training session in pig, fortunately I had the great opportunity to use 3D Laparoscopic system which had only one station of this workshop and this was my first time as well. In each station would have the experts from many institutions closely supervised the training. Not having to change the station and the coach made practice surgery had continued well. I also had the opportunity to practice using Hysteroscopy in training model as well. I had spent all morning in learning and practice without feeling exhausted but felt that the time passes very quickly.

# Reflection on APAGE 2014 Workshop in C.C.I., Shanghai, China

This years APAGE September workshop at the CCI in Shanghai themed 'single-port surgery' was highly specific and lots of fun to attend.

Single-Port Surgery (SPS) has emerged as a growing trend in minimally invasive surgery over the past few years. The two day workshop gave participants a deep insight into a new technique of laparoscopy and into the mindset of this small group of highly skilled practitioners that were willing to share their experience and exhibit this complex procedure.

The benefits of SPS are certianly seen in less postoperative pain, improved cosmetic results and patient satisfaction. A larger umbilical opening for specimen removal and for minilaparotomy are main benefits in regards of technical performance.

However due to 'its own learning curve', single port surgery is only recommended to be performed by laparoscopic surgeons well versed in traditional multiport laparoscopy. The main challenges to master with the SPS is the loss of triangulation, the collision of instruments and reduced vision. The introduction of new optics and specifically designed instruments (long, curved and articulating) require the practitioner to remaster the laproscopic procedure by reworking and practicing the new techniques via each learning step (pelvitrainer, wet lab, in the OR with mentor support).



Single-port robotic surgery (SS-dV) certainly offers some technical advantages and will be further developed.

The presenters provided useful tips and tricks to prevent, recognize and eliminate complications; umbilical herniation being the primary complication. It was also recommended to begin with reduced port surgery (RPS) until a single port was left when introducing single-port surgery to a laparoscopic department.

Yet in spite of all enthusiasm for SPS concerns were raised that the quality of surgery shall not be sacrificed for the sake of single-port. Furthermore, being a new discipline, single-port surgery lacks good-quality evidence based studies. It was also noted that SPS, in the oncological setting, requires more data to ensure that it is a feasible approach. This as well as long operating times limit SPS to a very select group of oncological patients.

After enjoying the morning lectures packed with interesting insights, amazing videos and lively discussions we then proceeded into the beautiful lab of the CCI. Our task was to perform a 5 step drill on the pelvitrainer to get used to the different technique of single-port. Having started with some trepidation we then found out it was quite easy and everyone passed the 'test'.

The following afternoon we met in the pig lab, with the same group and tutors only to find that - it wasn't that easy anymore! The ongoing collision of instruments, the loss of triangulation and limited view was quite the challenge although our tutor had great tricks and stayed amazingly calm and supportive. I cannot compliment to the whole team enough for their support and advice.

Our final task was to undertake a single-layered suture of a pig bladder injury! I found that maintaining good body alignment and comfortable working position, while manipulating multiple devices through a single entry point, was extremely difficult. I couldn't wait for the head and shoulder massage that evening...!

From my point of view single-port surgery is the pinnacle of laparoscopic technique. The workshop gave us a good idea of this and it was two days of great fun. Thank you for this fantastic learning opportunity!
